Question 12a and 12b – these percentages are based on the number of ticks given in total e.g. some parents ticked both a and b.

Suggestions and/or comments on how we can move our school forward:

- On questions where I have ticked don't know, I have done so as I have no evidence or experience of the subject to give a viewpoint. With regards to progress, I am sure if I asked, the teacher would update me, but apart from reports and parents evenings I do not feel I have regular or frequent updates.
- Deal with bullies in a better manner.
- I can't suggest anything to improve the methods used at the school. I'm very pleased with the work that the school puts into the children.
- Our Lady's is a great school and I have already recommended it to a few parents whilst considering school options. Only suggestion would be to send one newsletter per family instead of per child. That would help save paper.
- My son is doing very well. I am pleased with how he settled and feel that he is really thriving now.
- The school has always supported my children (past/present).
- I have never had to deal with bullying and that's why I have put don't know. I however think my daughter is well supported in school and the teachers are approachable in case of any concerns.
- A big thank you to all teachers and staff. I had a meeting with the teacher and she mentioned good progress. Thank you so much.
- I am impressed with how the school have managed with my son's needs and don't see any need for the school to change anything.
