The Early Years Foundation Stage

The children in the nursery and reception classes are in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

The next stage, Key Stage One, starts in Year 1.



Children are born ready, able and eager to learn. They actively reach out to interact with other people and in the world around them. Development is not an automatic process and it depends on each unique child having opportunities to interact in positive relationships and enabling environments.

In the EYFS it is recognised that children learn best when they can play and explore, are able to learn actively and are given opportunities to be creative and think critically.



In the EYFS the prime areas are fundamental, to learning and development:

Personal, Social and Emotional

Development,

Communication and Language and

Physical Development. Specific areas include essential skills and knowledge for children to participate successfully in society: Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.

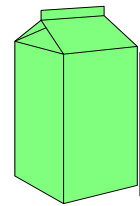
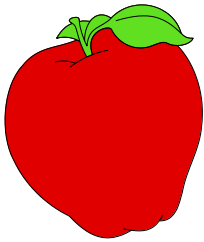


It is important within the early years foundation stage that the children have many opportunities to play both indoors

and outdoors. It is recognised by early years foundation stage staff that children learn best through play and having first hand experiences.

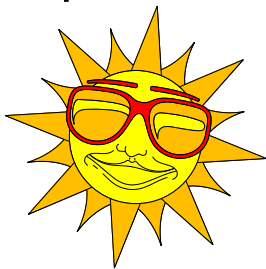
Snack Time

Reception Class Times

The reception children will attend for whole days, after the initial induction period. They will be able to have a school meal at lunchtime or bring a packed lunch from home.

Religious Education



During the year we will help the children to discover signs of God in their experience of themselves, the world and others.

In this year's programme we try to develop in the children attitudes of love, praise and thanks towards God Our Father, as well as attitudes of awe and wonder at the beauty and variety of His creation.

We aim to develop in the children a relationship with God Our Father and the children are encouraged to pray to God each day. They will learn simple formal prayers and have opportunities for silent and spontaneous prayer and for praying through gesture or action.

The children will also be taught about the main events in the life of Jesus.

Links with the rest of the school

During the year the children attend various assemblies. Our reception children will also attend some of the whole school Masses.

The children will take part in other events with the rest of the school e.g. sports day. The



children also take part in the school nativity play and will enjoy other events with them.

During the course of the year nursery children will spend some time in the reception class and play in the Key Stage One playground, this will help the children become used to a larger school environment and prepare them for the next year.

All the reception children have a 'buddy' from Year 6, who will support them and be their special friend in school.

The reception children will be taking part in P.E. lessons. They will need to have a named P.E. kit, which should be in a named bag.

The children will often be going out to play and will need suitable clothing for this e.g. a coat, hat and gloves in cold weather or a sunhat in warmer weather.

For the safety of your child only adults are allowed to bring and fetch the children in the nursery and reception classes.



Please tell us if someone different is coming for your child. Please be as prompt as possible collecting your child, as delay

may cause a child unnecessary worry!

Please do not send sweets etc. into the nursery and reception class as all the children will be given some fruit and a drink daily.
