

OLA Remote Learning Plan

If your child has to stay at home for reasons related to coronavirus, we will do everything we can to ensure access to quality teaching resources. We have put a number of things in place, depending on the reason why your child is not able to come into school.

The expectation is that your child will engage with the remote learning that is set for them.

Reason for absence	What school will do to support home learning
A child has to self-isolate because they or a member of their family are displaying symptoms of Coronavirus	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• children in Y1-Y6 will be directed to work from their Maths and English practice books.• Nursery and Reception children will receive a pack of appropriate work as soon as possible.• If, following a positive test result within the family, the child is unable to return to school the class teacher will prepare a home-learning pack which is linked to the current class learning. Arrangements will be made for the pack to be collected from school.
A whole class has to self-isolate for 14 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A two-week schedule will be available on their class page on the school website and shared via Dojo which children will be able to access from the first day that they cannot come into school. This will cover English, Maths and the broader curriculum.• A personalised schedule will be available for pupils with SEND that they can access independently.• Teachers in EYFS and Key Stage 1 will upload phonics lessons which are appropriate to their groups.
Pupils need to be educated remotely for an extended period of time due to	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• By Friday of each week, staff will share a weekly timetable of tasks for the following week with parents.• Tasks will be differentiated for SEND pupils.• Children will be asked to post their work on Dojo or Seesaw.• Feedback will be given through Dojo or Seesaw.• Staff will hold a whole class Zoom meeting once a week.• Staff will promptly follow up children who do not seem to engage with a phone call home.
children can't access online learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Teachers will put together a weekly pack for families to pick up from school. If possible, packs will be marked and feedback given.• The school will access the Government 'Get laptops and tablets for children who cannot attend school due to coronavirus (COVID-19)' scheme.• Teachers will phone parents once a week.
