Thursday 9th April Maundy Thursday: The Last Supper

The Disciples gathered to share the Passover Meal with Jesus. Before they began their last supper together, Jesus filled a bowl of water, knelt before each one of them and washed their feet. Through his example, he was teaching his friends to love one another as he had loved them.

During the meal, Jesus took the bread, blessed it and gave it them, saying,

"Take this. This is my body." Then he took the cup of wine, blessed it and gave it to them. "This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which will be poured out for everyone."

Jesus and the disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. Some of the disciples fell asleep. Judas arrived with soldiers armed with swords and sticks. He went up to Jesus, he said, "Rabbi," and kissed him. The guards took hold of Jesus and arrested him.

Friday 10th April Good Friday: The crucifixion of Jesus Early in the morning, the chief priests and the whole council led Jesus to Pilate for his trial. Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Jesus said, "The words are yours."

Pilate asked Jesus again. Jesus refused to say a word. Pilate spoke to the crowd, "What do you want me to do with this man you call King of the Jews?"

The crowd shouted back, "Crucify him!"

The soldiers took Jesus away. They put a purple robe on him, put a crown of thorns on his head and beat him with a stick. Bleeding and beaten, Jesus made the tortuous journey to Calvary, carrying his cross. At 9am, Jesus was nailed to the cross. Jesus cried out, "Father forgive them, they do not know what they are doing."

At 3 o'clock, Jesus called out, "Eloi, Eloi Lama Sabactani," which means, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Jesus gave out a loud cry and died. At that moment, the land became dark and the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. There was an earthquake and rocks were split.

Saturday 11th April Holy Saturday: The day between Jesus' death and resurrection

Holy Saturday, also called Easter Vigil, commemorates the day Jesus was laid in the tomb.

Joseph of Armathaea went to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. Joseph brought a linen sheet, took the body from the cross and wrapped it in the sheet. He laid it in a tomb carved out of rock. Mary of Magdala and Mary the mother of Joseph were watching and made note of where Jesus laid.

Holy Saturday have a quiet and reflective day. You could read a book instead of watching TV, write your own Easter story.

Sunday 12th April Easter Sunday: Jesus' resurrection

Very early on Sunday morning, Mary Magdela and Mary mother of Joseph went to the tomb. They took with them spices that they had prepared. When they arrived, the stone had been rolled away from the tomb but when they went inside they could not find the body of Jesus. As they stood there puzzled, a man appeared in bright shining clothes. The women were terrified. "Do not be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here. He has been raised from death. Come and see the place where he lay, and then go quickly and tell the disciples that he is risen from the dead and is going ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there." Filled with joy, they ran to tell the disciples.

Suddenly, Jesus was there, "Peace be with you," he said. The women bowed down to worship him and took hold of his feet. Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers that they must go to Galilee; they will see me there."

"Happy Easter! May you bring to all the joy and hope of the Risen Christ!" Pope Francis.
