Christmas Carols

Important information about what to do if your child tests positive for COVID-19 over the holiday:

If your child tests positive for covid-19 over the holiday, it is essential that you still contact school. You can do this by completing an online form via this <u>link</u>. Parents will only be contacted if the information in the form is unclear, or if there is 'in school' contact tracing required. If you cannot access this link, then please send a text to 07783032220. The isolation requirements for positive cases are 10 days from symptom onset, or from test day if asymptomatic. The first day of symptoms or the date of the test will be day 0, so isolation would finish on day 11 if there is no fever for 48 hours.
